War of words

MAHIKENG MAIL – An ugly confrontation was this week simmering between the road construction company, MCivils Makali CivilsCon Joint Venture and an SMME, On the Move Road Construction and Maintenance (Pty LTD) situated in the Rooigrond area.

MCivils Joint Venture was awarded the tender valued at R465,9m two years ago to re-construct the Mandela Highway between Mahikeng and Lichtenburg and in accordance with the constitution was required to appoint local residents living in the nearby Danville, Dihatswana village and Rooigrond areas as beneficiaries of the 28,5km project.

On the Move Construction and Maintenance company director, Peter Maake told Mahikeng Mail in an exclusive interview last week that MCivils was instructed to create job opportunities for 560 unemployed people from the affected wards in the areas the company operates.

"To date only a handful of unemployed people from ward 27 are involved in the project. Our company is at Grade 1 and according to Government Preferential Procurement Legislation which became effective on April 1 2017, any project which is above R30m, 30 percent of it must be sub-contracted to locals and 6 percent must be for job creation.

"However, our company has never been considered since the project started seven months ago. We have exhausted all the right channels to get our company involved in the project but to no avail", said Maake who also told Mahikeng Mail that when he approached the company, "the manager on site was assisted by about 30 employees to severely assault me. I reported the matter to the police who arrested only four of the culprits."

Maake has also reported the failure by the company to involve his company in the project to the provincial Legislature, the local councillor, the department public works roads as wells as Bua Le Puso government initiative at the Setsokotsane Operation Centre in Mmabatho.

Dismissing the allegations this week, Luambo Majune, acting chief director at public works, denied that the workers had assaulted Maake claiming that the latter had in fact gone to the site office and fought with the employees who reported the incident to the police. "This is currently a police case and we can't comment further," Majune said.

He also denied that On the Move had not been involved in the project adding that a total of 63 locals had in fact been appointed where to date MCivils had paid out a total of R2.1m towards local labour while a total of R69,000 had been paid to sub-contractors.

Mahikeng Municipality remains mum on assault reports

MAHIKENG MAIL – MAHIKENG: Municipal Manager of the Mahikeng Local Municipality (MLM), Thabo Mokoena said this week that he would only comment on concerns raised by members of Bana Ba Mahikeng concerned group next week when he returns from leave.

Mokoena was reacting to a list of questions send to MLM mayor, Betty Diakano by Mahikeng Mail in which the newspaper was seeking the municipality's reaction to the complains raised by the concerned group. According to Abigail Batala, communications head at the municipality, Mokoena who was on leave informed her that he would only respond to our questions when he returned from leave next week.

According to Bana Ba Mahikeng, they had tried for more than a year to get permission to be allowed to stage a protest march to raise several concerns with Diakanyo's office. When everything else failed, the decided to discuss the matter with the mayor and were allowed to approach her office.

However ones at the Mayor's office, they were confronted by a group of about 20 heavily built security guards who prevented them from seeing Diakanyo. They were reportedly beaten up thrown against desks and other office furniture. One of the members suffered a broken hand and fingers during the incident. The men are part of a security company, KNRNPN, appointed to provide security services to Diakanyo and Mokoena. The company is paid well over R2m monthly according to information availed to Mahikeng Mail. They are said to be foreigners from Zimbabwe.

Complaints by members of the public who have expressed concern about the presence of the "bouncers" at the municipal offices have not been addressed by the municipality whose management has also not explained how and why they were appointed when there is no public threat

to both the mayor, municipal manager or any municipal staff. They have also not answered questions about whether the municipality could in fact afford to pay over R2m monthly for security services. Answers to questions about the duration of the KNRNPN contract and who owns the company will hopefully be provided by Mokoena when he returns from leave next week. (For the record, Mahikeng Mail knows the owner but we will leave it to Mokoena to confirm the name during our set interview next week).

Why EFF demand MEC Manketsi Tlhape to resign

The former Prime Minister and authoritarian leader of Singapore, Lee Kuan Yew, once proclaimed that Singapore will only achieve the objective of economic growth and prosperity if it chose the best men and women to lead in government. Lee said: "we stand a better chance of not failing if we abide by the basic principles that have helped us progress social cohesion through the sharing of the benefits of progress, equal opportunities for all and meritocracy with the best men and women for the job, especially leaders in government." The word "meritocracy" in the vision of the former leader of Singapore stands out and it simply means that public office should be the province of those who resemble capacity, ethical and moral rectitude. But the same word "meritocracy" cannot be used in the same sentence with the name

of the MEC of Agriculture and Rural Development out of this illegal transaction is none other than the in the North West Province. MEC Manketsi Tlhape is an antithesis of clean and ethical governance. The National Portfolio Committee on Environmental Affairs has order MEC Manketsi Tlhape last year to reverse a donation of wildlife valued at over R100 million which was made to the Southern African Rare Game Breeders Holdings (SARGBH). The National Portfolio Committee on Environmental Affairs found that there is a prima facie evidence indicating that the North West Province Department of Agriculture and Rural Development failed to comply with the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) when donating animals. Those fraudulently donated rare species include 130 buffalos, 50 white rhinos, 50 sables and 32 nyalas. The company that benefited

(SARGBH) which is owned by the Premiers friends, Matthews Wolmarans, his former municipal manager in Rustenburg Local Municipality, Andries Boshoff and a business man, Mike de Kock. According biodiversity experts, SARGBH is set to make millions in profits from breeding and sales. This corrupt deal left only 11 buffalo bulls without any cows in Molemane Park. In Borakalalo Park, there were only 18 bulls left. Reports indicate that in Pilanesberg it was worse as there were no sable antelopes left after the donation. The implication of this corrupt deal is that the breeding cycle in government owned parks is seriously compromised. Lies and obfuscations of the impeding danger facing wildlife in government owned parks were manufactured to justify this corrupt donation. Recent submissions to the National Department of Environmental Affairs indicate that wildlife in the above-mentioned parks was never in danger. After failing to appear before the national portfolio committee when she was summoned in 2016, MEC Manketsi Tlhape's department also attempted to sanitize the deal by claiming that it was part of transformation in the biodiversity sector aimed at empowering black people. But the MEC was left with an egg on her face when she eventually admitted to the portfolio committee that the donation of animals did not comply with the principles of due "diligence." The latter is nothing but a euphemism admitting corruption that benefited senior ANC politicians. Scandals of this nature in any self-respecting democracy will send the public representative packing. But not in South Africa let alone in the North West Province where corruption that benefits senior ANC politicians has been normalized and the public has been numbed by 'information fatigue' as no one ever face consequences despite incredible revelations of corruption. Instead, it is the comics of politics in the province that receive prime-time and attention. The Premier's laughable cases of witchcraft (metaphysics) makes headlines but serious issues of corruption, political assassinations and maladministration are casually captured in the public space. The phrase "catch all" is very much relevant to the North West Province as it illustrates the extent to which various public institutions from government to media houses have been captured by the premier of this province. Communities in the North West Province also seem to be engulfed with fear of questioning injustice as their livelihood is inextricably tied to the state that is led by men and women who are the opposite of "meritocracy" as articulated by the former Prime Minister of Singapore. The society's actions and inaction against social injustice succinctly fits the description of an African as defined by the Kenyan anti-corruption champion, John Githongo in the book titled It's Our Turn to Eat. Githongo says: "Africans are the most subservient people on earth when faced with force, intimidation and power. Africa, all said and done, is a place where we grovel before leaders." MEC Manketsi Tlhape must resign in

the name of integrity and clean governance!

CAN THIS MONEY BE SAVED? Cancer Deaths Cost BRICS over R500 Bn/Year

As South Africa mourns the recent death of the legendary Hugh Masekela, it is apparent that this dread disease has forever silenced serenading trumpet of Bra Hugh. His death comes hot on the heels of the loss of other notables such as Michelle Molatlou. These artists have become

part of the over 50 000 South Africans who die from cancer annually. Cancer is a very costly disease. It brings with it medical and personal costs. Cancer drugs are among the most expensive drugs and often have intolerable adverse effects. However cancer death has an economic cost beyond medical costs that is often not appreciated. Recently (January 16) the Journal of Cancer Epidemiology released a study which investigated the economic cost of premature cancer death due to productivity loss in Brazil, Russia, India, China and South Africa (BRICS). The latest most complete data that the scientists had access to was for the year 2012, and they estimated that this economic cost was US\$ 46.3 billion (over R500 Bn) in that year. This represents 0.33% of their combined GDP. When they looked at individual countries, South Africa had the highest cost per death at \$ 101 000 (over R 1 million). South Africa's cost per death was five times

The scientists further stated a very well-known fact that most of these deaths and their resultant costs could have been avoided. The two cancers that cost the most productivity loss in BRICS were lung and liver cancer. This is obviously related to smoking as well as the use of alcohol. China is the biggest tobacco market globally. Over half the cigarettes smoked in the world are smoked in China. Russia is not too far behind accounting for over 10% of global cigarette use. So one can conclude that over two thirds of cigarettes produced are consumed in BRICS. In the same journal (December 2017) the National Institute of Occupational Health(NIOH) reported that Western Cape, Northern Cape and the Free State had the highest incidence of cancer deaths among South African provinces. This revelation was not surprising since the Human Science Research Council (HSRC) had already declared that these provinces have the highest prevalence of tobacco use in the country - Western Cape (33%), Northern Cape (31%) and Free State (27%).

Besides lung and cervical cancer, cancers of the prostate, oesophagus and breast are among the leading causes of cancer death. Kaposis sarcoma which usually affects HIV immunocompromised individuals also takes its toll. The picture is not entirely hopeless. Premature and unnecessary cancerdeath is avoidable. Many epidemiological studies have demonstrated certain factors within our control that can decrease the chances of getting and dying from cancer. Thousands of people are quitting smoking and drinking every year. In the US the number of ex-smokers has been greater than that of current smokers since 2002. As a result death from lung cancer among US males has dropped by 45% since 1990. Rational food choices, based on the body's physiological needs rather than the palate is also a proven anti-cancer strategy. Delaying sexual intercourse and reducing the number of sexual partners is an effective preventive measure against cervical cancer. Finally the rational use of medicinal plants can prevent cancer and even delay death in those who have been diagnosed. In a recent case-control study (Journal of Ethnopharmacology) 264 lung cancer patients were given Chinese herbal medicines along with regular treatment and were compare with 528 patients given regular treatment only.

The rate of death among those prescribed herbs was half that of the controls. Another study in the same journal using a retrospective design corroborated these results. No significant adverse effects or herb-drug interactions were reported. We do not necessarily have to import herbs from China since many of our indigenous plants are being investigated for similar effects. However we are still far behind our BRICS partners in exploiting our rich flora to such ends, with nearly all of our experiments being done in petri dishes, test tubes and lab rats. Even this research can be misguided by researchers trying to find potent antitumour isolated compounds rather than the cancer preventive potential of whole plants.

There isn't a single supplement or concoction that you can take to prevent cancer. One must apply all the rational lifestyle factors at their disposal such as adequate sleep, regular exercise, sensible nutrition, indigenous foods, loving relationships, etc. You may not play the trumpet and rock the stage like Bra Hugh, but if you die from cancer we will have lost a least a million rand. And those who love you will have lost more than what money can buy. So be sensible. Beproactive. Do something this year that will prolong your life, and save us all a bit of money.

Politicians must not use cheap point-scoring political tricks to address Cape water crisis

Water and Sanitation Minister, Nomvula Mokonyane has correctly urged politicians and their cronies not play politics with the lives of Cape Town residents who are already facing life-threatening situation of running out of water on April 16, the new Day Zero.

We have recently seen and heard politicians throwing their dirty politics into the water crisis while the national government and the Western Cape administration are fighting hard to find solutions to the water problem facing the mother city.

Instead of coming up with strategies to assist in the difficulty, all these politicians are interested in are to use their stinking politics to attract voters to their parties.

Also reacting to what appeared to be an increasing sickness of politicising the Western Cape disaster, Chairperson of the Select Committee on Social Services, Cathy Dlamini this week cautioned against pointing fingers and turning the ongoing water crisis in the Western Cape into a political point-scoring match.

We agree that the people of the Western Cape deserve leadership and guidance during this time and all spheres of government must meet their specific responsibilities to ensure the continued availability of water.

The Committee reiterates the need for collaboration between all three spheres of government to provide the requisite leadership and guidance in these times of uncertainty.

"We continue to call for full cooperation between the national departments of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs, and Water and Sanitation; the Western Cape Department of Local Government, Environmental Affairs and Development Planning together with the City of Cape Town in finding solutions to this crisis," said Dlamini.

With the scary Day Zero having been pushed back by four days this week, various water saving efforts implemented by Cape Town residents, there was renewed hope that the Day Zero problem could actually be defeated.

The Committee further reiterates the call for changes in water-use behaviour. "The people of Cape Town must also chip in, assist by reducing consumption and adhering to restrictions," Dlamini said.

SAVE NORTH WEST

The life-threatening happenings at the Ratshidi Community Hall last weekend (Saturday) must be a clear indication to the warring parties involved in the fracas about the seriousness of the fight against corruption in the province.

The confrontation between the group calling themselves, Safe North West (SNW) campaign and ANC members supporting North West Premier, Supra Mahumapelo left one person hospitalised with a bullet wound to the leg and several properties including a car and chairs completely destroyed at the hall.

The ANC has described SNW as a group masquerading as anti-corruption activists and wants to cause unease in the province with claims that they're fighting corruption by ANC provincial chairperson, Supra Mahumapelo.

"This group led by some within our party, has been going around lobbying people to join and support their actions", said ANC deputy provincial secretary, Sussana Dantjie also claiming that the intention of the SNW campaign was to destabilise the province and trying to force the removal of Mahumapelo as premier of the province.

"We condemn their actions and the use of ANC colours in the agenda that's clearly self-serving and has got nothing to do with the party", Dantjie added.

Developments took an interesting turn this week when the group now also known as the Revolutionary Council opened cases of attempted murder, intimidation, malicious damage to property and theft out of a vehicle at the Mahikeng police station.

SNW has threatened to continue with their action in which they will be collecting evidence of corruption involving Supra Mahumapelo and his government while Mahumapelo said the provincial PEC would report the incident to and ANC President, Cyril Ramaphosa and his NEC next Monday. They said the SNW campaign was not in the interest of the new ANC's spirit of unifying the movement.

It will certainly be interesting to see which way the wind will be blowing within the next few days and weeks.

Tourism committee condemns attack on tourists

MAHIKENG MAIL - MAHIKENG: The Portfolio Committee on Tourism has this week condemned the increased attacks on tourists and hikers on the Table Mountain range during the holiday season. Notably, this past Sunday a man was stabbed to death on the mountain above St James, Cape Town.

Further, the alleged sexual assault of a African National Parks to collaborate and tourist at a police roadblock outside OR Tambo International Airport in Gauteng is concerning, as the police should be protectors from and not perpetrators of such heinous to be vigilant and to work closely with deeds.

The Committee is concerned that these attacks will affect tourism, which is a major role player in the economy, particularly in Cape Town, South Africa's key international tourist destination.

Fewer tourists visiting South Africa will impact on jobs and the related spin-offs of this industry.

This comes at a time when South Africa is attempting to improve the economy by attracting international investors.

Chairperson of the Portfolio Committee on Tourism, Beatrice Ngcobo, calls on the Provincial Department of Tourism, the national Department of Tourism, the South African Police Service and South institute mechanisms to make these tourist destinations safer.

Under the theme "The Business of both nationally and internationally in Acting", the workshop was designed to countries like Swaziland, Zimbabwe, empower youth and adults who want to Monte Carlo, Britain, USA and New enter the acting world by teaching them the Zealand. Her theatre experience includes Porgy and Bess, Little Shop of Horrors, The project is led by the veteran actress Ipi Ntombi, Wathint' abafazi, Wathint' imbokodo (You strike a woman, you strike a rock). She also co-produced and acted in Bubbly Bosoms.

'There is no better way for me to celebrate my forty years in this industry than to share my experiences and advice to aspiring theatre, television and film practitioners, she said. "I have decided to embark on a national tour just to say- this is how show business works, to all aspiring actors." She had been to six Provinces since the inception of the programme. Mahikeng Mail-Mahikeng- The Department of health has incorporated community health workers into the health system to improve efficiency, health promotion and to support chronic patients.

Community health workers play a critical role in the healthcare system by supporting chronic patients and nursing them back to good health. Over the years their roles increased to include that of community empowerment and linking communities with health facilities.

Community health workers play the role of peer educators, community councilors, care givers, and treatment of default tracers.

Wendy Ditlhamelo from Sunrise Park is one of the 7224 community health workers in the province. Ditlhamelo (35), is currently servicing the areas within the Rustenburg Health Sub District.

"My job entails supplying medication to chronic patients and checking if they are taking treatment as prescribed.

"I derive joy in seeing my patients getting back to good health," Ditlhamelo said.

Asked about challenges she faces on a daily basis, she said: "Patients who provide wrong details make it difficult for community health workers to support them.

"I had a TB patient who supplied the clinic with incorrect information. After he missed few medication collection dates, I had to trace him to the address he provided only to realise that it was wrong. We made further enquiries and found that the patient had lost the battle.

"Such situations could be avoided with the support of community health workers. It is important for patients to furnish clinics with relevant information when they open files," she said with a tearful eye. Ditlhamelo advises patients to embrace community health workers as they are there to support them.

The Department of Health has added community health workers in the Primary Health Care (PHC) Re-engineering to strengthen community based health services.

PHC Re-engineering puts more emphasis on health promotion and preventative services at household level. It consists of PHC outreach teams for each electoral ward; strengthening school health service and District based clinical specialist teams with an initial focus on improving maternal and child health.

The department purchased 364 bicycles for CHWs in the Dr. Kenneth Kaunda District, a National Health Insurance pilot site, in an effort to improve daily coverage and contact with chronic patients.

MEC Dr. Magome Masike said his department continues to look for alternative and innovative solutions to address health.

"Pointing fingers at each other won't help us" - MEC Lehari

MAHIKENG MAIL-MAHIKENG: Department of Education MEC Sello Lehari met with underperforming and performed principals last Friday at the Convention Centre. The meeting was to seek intervention in the underperforming schools and also to applaud the schools that performed well on the 2017 Matric results, Reports Teboho Letselela.

MEC Sello Lehari argued how it was important to review previous academic year performance and planning for the current academic year to obtain position three for the 2018 results. "I would like to succinctly put it to you that I am not happy at all, I am very much disappointed by the performance we have obtained. This performance has affected many stakeholders in the province, since everyone put their hopes on us," said MEC Lehari.

The department wished to sustain and improve in their learner's outcomes from Grade R to 12 in order to bring about accountability for learner performance, basic functionality in schools, protecting time for teaching and learning and provision of resources in schools. The department ensured all necessary support was given to enable conducive teaching and learning environment, however an assessment must be done to find out where the department lacked to achieve great results.

Concerns over the department's delays on other necessities in schools by principals were they said they are not equipped well with appointing of teachers on time or delivering books in schools which causes underperformance in schools. The Department promised to work on providing whatever is needed by schools and to intensify monitoring and moderation of schools across the province.

However the MEC applauded those who did well on their final year results and encouraged them to keep up with standards of producing good results. "I am appealing to you today that we all go back to our drawing boards and work to improve the results of our province."

Two rape accused sentenced

Mahikeng Mail-Mahikeng- The fight against sexual offences gained another victory in the province when two men were sentenced in separate incidents of rapes to 15 and 10 years respectively by Mmabatho Magistrate's Court last week.

In the first incident, a 26-year-old Onalenna Surprise Seitsang was sentenced to 10-years imprisonment after he raped a 20-year-old woman on Sunday, 7 April 2017. It was reported at the time of the incident that victim was at a certain hotel when she went to the toilet. She was approached by the accused who raped her inside the toilet. The accused was arrested after the incident was reported to the police. In another incident, a 22-yearold woman was on her way home from her aunt's place when she met a 20-yearold Ompolokile Motshegare at about 19:000 on Friday, 7 July 2017. The accused dragged the victim to the nearby bushes and raped her. The rape case was opened and the suspect was arrested. The North West Provincial Commissioner, Lieutenant General Baile Motswenyane congratulated Mmabatho Family Violence, Child Protection and Sexual Offences Unit (FCS) for securing the sentences. She said that the police will continue to work hard so that those who commit crimes are successfully prosecuted.

Speaker after speaker referred to Kgosi Mangope as a God given leader who led his

people with utmost diligence. The speakers included some of his cabinet ministers who served with Mangope during his rule. When giving tribute on behalf of the Botswana government and the Bo-Manyana in Botswana, Kgosikgolo Kebinatshwene 1 Mosielele referred to the Mangope family as the model of leadership that many countries had learned from. Mosielele urged the Bo-Manyana to remain united as the nation would still stand to learn a lot from the kind

of leadership left behind by Kgosi Mangope. Mangope leaves behind his children, wife Violet Mangope and many more members of the Bahurutshe Bo-Manyana both in South Africa and in Botswana. Meanwhile the Mangope family has thanked all people who braved the heavy rain to pay their last respects to the late Kgosi Mangope in Motswedi. "We thank all people for their heartfelt support and condolence messages", said Mme Ipotseng Ditshetelo.

But then so are India (still atop the muchdebated, official ICC ladder), Australia and bowling stocks - both young and more England, frankly.

The Proteas, now on 115 rating points, have closed the gap a little on the Indians (121), whilst Australia remain third on the pecking order (104) and England are currently fifth (99).

Just for the moment, perhaps, New Zealand have wriggled their way as a fifth element into the traditional "big four" terrain ... they presently lie fourth on 100 points, helped by the fact that England were so badly mauled (4-0) in the recent five-Test Ashes series Down Under.

But even if the Black Caps and Pakistan certainly have their moments, most Test connoisseurs would acknowledge that generally the key bragging rights in the longformat landscape lie between the other, more historically consistent quartet.

In short, there is no great Test team in the world right now.

Certainly nothing to match the potent West Indies combinations of the late 1970s and 1980s, the dominant Australian forces under the charge of Tubby Taylor and then Steve Waugh in the 1990s and early 2000s, or the spells from the mid-2000s when Duncan Fletcher-coached England sides became a significant handful again.

You might throw in the phases of the Graeme Smith-captained Proteas era when they earned seminal away series triumphs over most traditional rivals Australia and England in pretty quick succession, during a run of 14 series (2009 to 2013) without defeat.

But a glance at various "big four" series results over the last two or three years only reminds that no single, routinely imperious force exists these days.

Results see-saw fairly violently, with a team earning a handsome home-turf triumph, for example, quite quickly earning a bumpto-earth experience under notably different conditions abroad.

South Africa will possibly be regrouping under new coach Ottis Gibson gathered plausibility with the most recent, albeit hardearned 2-1 home victory over India.

Bull-necked though Faf du Plessis and company were during the series (only losing in a dead-rubber situation, remember) it nevertheless showed up some nagging frailties, most notably in the lack of regular heavy scoring from the orthodox batting department.

much: their constant capacity to bounce back with some stealth is impressive.

The Baggy Greens will come here boasting a real walloping of England in the recent Ashes, and no doubt anxious to preserve their record of not being beaten in SA in the post-isolation era.

Their four-man frontline bowling attack (Messrs Starc, Hazlewood, Cummins and Lyon) is about as settled as they come, although the impression remains that runs on sportier surfaces - perhaps one or two of those here soon? - could be in shortish supply if the mega-dangerous Steve Smith and everaggressive David Warner don't spark.

The current Aussie crop also can't hold a candle to the Waugh-era troops for undisputed domination of the planet because their Subcontinent record is so bilious over the last few years, in particular.

It says so much about how home conditions still play such a huge (unsatisfactorily so, perhaps?) role in determining series among the top nations that England can look a million dollars on their often seaming, cloud-covered pitches ... but then flounder when they tackle Indian turners or fast and true Australian surfaces.

Bear in mind that their last two results in both those countries are 4-0 humiliations over the course of five Tests each time.

That said, veteran maestros of home bowling needs like James Anderson and Stuart Broad should come steaming back into the wickets column - after a really backbreaking winter in Australia - in looming home series against Pakistan and then the Indians.

England still have the gem that is Joe Root (Test average 53.28), and the fair claim that their tail often wags very spiritedly, but the specialist support for the skipper with the willow hasn't been great shakes of late.

There is an enduring argument, as well, around whether England almost have too many "versatile" cricketers in their Test midst ...
